### **From the Office of the Chief Operating Officer**

There is something about the first few months of the new year that stirs optimism -- even if the state of the world around us doesn't always support it. In January our organization pledged to embrace the best vision of what lies ahead of us, choosing positivity over unease as we walk together and tackle any challenges (and we have already seen many) presented to us. I trust that there is nothing we can't accomplish when we are aligned in a shared belief or passion as a community. Personally, I hope that when the groundhog emerges from the burrow on February 2<sup>nd</sup> the indication tells us that winter will soon end and there will be brighter days ahead.

The Omicron variant continues to cause concern in our region and at the time of writing our newsletter multiple congregate living facilities remain on outbreak status. As an organization we do our best to evaluate quality of life for our community while completing the necessary risk assessments for our residents, staff, visitors, and facility.

Our priority is always protecting the health and wellness of our community to the best of our ability, and we are committed to transparency with our internal and external stakeholders while maintaining an individual's right to privacy.

Our community, although healthy within, has not been untouched by this new variant. We are fortunate that the swift and diligent actions of impacted individuals to recognized, report and isolate themselves or those stricken around them, have assisted us to remain protected.

We continue to tap into different networks, connections, community associations and partnerships to provide new programming, recreational opportunities, and restorations for our Centre. We remain mindful that this comes with limitations on group size restrictions and procedural policies, response times for service calls from outside agencies and situational happenings within our Centre. We appreciate everyone's patience as we navigate these thresholds which may cause delays, frustration, and disappointment, not always within our control.

I kindly ask that we all remain conscious of how we can be a part of the solution to the ongoing conditions we are all facing within our health zone. We continue to advocate for continuous and appropriate mask wearing within the Centre when residents are not in their personal suites and/or eating and drinking in the Café and Atrium, as well as the practice of good hand hygiene.

As a gentle reminder all guests must wear surgical masks continuously while visiting the facility, including in residents' personal suites. Any visitors feeling unwell should not be coming into the Centre for any reason.

I hope that February brings everyone opportunities to share the gift of time and love with the individuals you hold dearest. Happy Valentine's and Family Day to all!

## IMPORTANT NOTICES

★ **MAIN OFFICE** – CLOSED on Monday, February 21<sup>st</sup> for the *Family Day* holiday.

★ **GENERATOR TESTING** – Monday, February 10<sup>th</sup> starting at 2:00pm

Maintenance Department will be performing routine testing of the building's emergency generators.

★ **FIRE ALARM TESTING** – Tuesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup> starting at approximately 8:00am

AMPTEC Fire & Security will be performing annual testing of the building's fire & emergency alarms.

★ **BATTERY DISPOSAL** – Per current Federal and Provincial guidelines, ordinary batteries are not considered hazardous waste and can be disposed of with regular household trash. Accordingly, and in consideration of COVID best practices, St. Andrew's Centre has now discontinued collecting used batteries from residents.

★ **SHOWER CURTAIN RODS** – Maintenance staff have been receiving frequent requests to re-install shower curtain rods recently. Please be aware that these rods are designed to support shower curtains only.

If you hang wet clothes (from hand-washing) on the shower curtain rod, the weight may cause the rod to dislodge or fall – and water may drip onto the floor creating another safety hazard and/or damages.

Please consider using a clothes-drying rack instead. Choose a style or model that will fit inside your shower or tub to safely drip-dry hand-washed items.

★ **PARKING** – Please remember to instruct your guests to use the outdoor parking lot on the WEST side of the building when visiting. Underground parkade spaces are strictly reserved for paid rental subscribers.

★ **HALLWAY RENOVATIONS**

Hallway renovations including flooring, wall painting and door painting will recommence sometime in February. Advanced notice will be given to affected residents of each floor and corridor being worked on.

## SUITE MAINTANCE COSTS

The Centre has experienced a large volume of calls and expense in the last few months related to plugged toilets and sinks that have required a great deal of maintenance staff time to repair or the use of an outside agency. Please note that the following measure will be applied effective immediately as per tenant's lease agreement.

- 10.1.** The Tenant will be responsible for keeping the Premises and appliances clean and in good condition, and for the cost of clearing plugged toilets, sinks and drains if an inappropriate item such as incontinence products, hygiene products, excessive paper towel or other are found. The Tenant will also be responsible for supplying all the light bulbs and tubes in the Premises and can request a work order with the maintenance department for the light to be changed.

Tenants who experience clogged drains due to food, hair, etc. and/or plugged toilets due to inappropriate items flushed or large amounts of toilet paper usage will be charge a service fee from maintenance for the labor related to the repair. If an outside agency is used and it is deemed a problem incurred from the resident, the resident will be invoiced for the service call.



## RENTAL INCREASE

As a part of our organizational policy it is the obligation of the Board of Directors to review facility operating costs, current comparable market value of rents, consumer price index indicators, etc. during the November board meeting to evaluate and decide on a potential rental increase for our facility. As such, keeping in mind the challenges of the current world state due to the pandemic, the Board has voted unanimously in favor of a rental increase of **2%**.

As per the landlord and tenant act, with month-to-month tenancy leases, residents must receive three (3) months written notice of the rental increase that states the date of the increase.

Each resident will receive a letter with indications of **amount and date effective specific to them 3 months prior to the increase**. Notices will be hand-delivered to residents mailboxes starting on February 1, 2022. If you do not receive a letter in your mailbox on February 1<sup>st</sup>, you have not resided at the Center for a period of 365 days at that time. Letters will be continuously delivered to applicable tenants on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month when the rental increase can be legally applied throughout the year.

# CURRENT CONDITIONS

COVID-19 PANDEMIC  
Congregate Living Centers

St. Andrew's Centre continues to operate in accordance with health measures prescribed by the Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH), for Alberta.

Our sincere appreciation goes out to all of our residents, staff, vendors, suppliers and visitors who are consistently doing their very best to help to keep our community safe!

## RESIDENT POLICIES

- ✓ **If you are feeling unwell, please STAY IN YOUR SUITE and telephone the Main Office @ 780-452-4444 so that we may provide you with the necessary information and instructions to ensure our community stays as safe as possible.**

**Please be reminded that you must stay in your suite until all symptoms are resolved.** The Garden Café can arrange meal deliveries, if needed. The Hospitality Department can assist with garbage disposal, if needed. Additionally, residents must wear a mask continuously outside of their personal suites for a period of 5 days following their isolation period.

- ✓ **Residents who are absent for more than 24 hours**, regardless of their immunization status, are required to actively screen daily for symptoms of COVID-19 and wear a surgical/procedure mask when outside of their room, except when eating or drinking, **for 14 days post-return**. Resident screening checklists and appropriate masks are available from the Main Office and the health assessment desk in our front lobby.

RESIDENTS are encouraged to wear masks in the common areas of the Centre and continue good hand hygiene.

## VISITOR POLICIES

- ✓ ALL visitors to the Centre must enter the building through the Main Door to be screened at the Health Assessment Desk (Front Lobby) and to sign in.
- ✓ ALL visiting persons must wear a surgical/procedure mask while in our facility, even in RESIDENT SUITES, unless a resident has communication challenges where a mask would inhibit interacting. In which case, the resident and visiting persons should maintain a distance of two (2) meters from each other.
- ✓ Anyone who is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID, will **not be allowed entry into our facility** (within 14 days of last exposure) regardless of vaccination status. This is a directive that was made by the CMOH in mid-December.
- ✓ Visitors of residents are permitted to visit and eat in The Garden Café and common areas of the Center if verifiable proof of vaccination is provided (not required for children under 12 years of age). To facilitate this, staff now have "QR" code scanners at the Health Assessment Desk (Front Lobby) and at the cash register in the Garden Café.

**Window Washing** – Available by request. Fee depends on suite style.


**Carpet Cleaning** – Available by request. Fee to be determined per request.

- Monthly Invoices for Hospitality Service and/or *Garden Café* purchases are **due upon receipt**. If your payment is not received by the **15<sup>th</sup> of the month**, we will contact you and your account may be suspended until full payment is made.
  - Invoices overdue by 30 days or more will have accounts and services suspended and residents will have to pay per purchase indefinitely. **\*\*PLEASE NOTE\*\* accounts exceeding \$500.00 may be flagged and called sooner than the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month.**
  - Using your DEBIT CARD or a CREDIT CARD is the preferred method when paying invoices.
  - **ACCOUNT CHANGES**, such as: parking rental; storage rental; meal packages; or changes to banking information for Pre-Authorized Payments, you must inform the Main Office **before the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month**.
