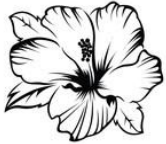

## Atrium

There are many donated plants throughout the atrium. It has taken a while to place them into the various tropical beds. Thank you to the friends and families for the new plants that have increased the beauty and variety in the atrium.

With any plant donation they **must first be approved** then necessary steps are taken to eradicate pests before entering the building. Pest control is ongoing and any new plant, small or large, can potentially cause a lot of damage. The biological controls (good bugs that eat bad ones) will be increased over the next few months as a precautionary measure. For anyone wanting to donate for more biological controls, please see the main office.

Aeration of the tropical beds was moved to October. It will be a Saturday later this month and notices will be posted.

6. Business arising from the last meeting/old business:  
There were no outstanding matters from the previous meeting.

7. Standing Agenda Items:

7.1 – Food Service: The Café focus group session was held on August 23, 2022. Some suggestions were immediately implemented. Theme Meals – a written suggestion was given for theme meals such as Mexican, Italian, etc. The committee pointed out that theme meals are already available and can be found on the monthly dinner menus.

7.2 – Maintenance/Housekeeping:

There were no comments for maintenance or housekeeping at this time.

7.3 – Social/Leisure Activities:

- It was asked if AMSA will be returning. Wanda is currently in discussions with AMSA to plan their return to the Centre.
- Is the library accepting donations? We are not accepting donations at the moment as the main volunteer librarian is currently not available. We are searching for a new volunteer to manage the residents' library. After some discussion, Linda H. and Patti P. have volunteered to manage the library.

7.4 – Security:

A concern was brought up regarding the use of the Prayer Room as a shortcut by security. Wanda will inform security to avoid using this passageway if it is not an emergency. The implementation of 24/7 security is still in progress.

8. New Business (suggestion box/Committee concerns/emails):

Suggestion Box:

8.1 Notice Board in the Annex – a written suggestion was made to add a poster board for those living on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor in the annex. This decision will be deferred at this time. For the time being, information is provided in the monthly newsletters as well as the bulletin boards by the West and East elevators.

8.2 Breakfast Card/Pancake Breakfast – a written complaint was made stating that they had used their breakfast punch card for the Pancake Breakfast when this breakfast was cheaper than the punch card. Please be mindful of the cost of meals when using your punch cards. Residents are accountable for their own actions and decisions.

8.3 Fire Evacuation and Muster Point – a written complaint was made regarding the fire evacuation and muster point. St. Andrew’s Centre has no control over the muster point location. The Edmonton Fire Department insists that it must remain outside. The next safest place to be instead of going outside is the stairwell. The Red Card Program was created if you need to remain in your suite. A suggestion was made to have an announcement of where the fire is located. This is not possible as we cannot speak on top of the fire alarms and all staff must evacuate the main office. Another fire presentation will be scheduled.

Intercom System – regular complaints are made regarding the intercom system. It was suggested that the announcer speak slow and wait until they repeat their announcement so that residents will have time to get to the hallways to hear what is being said.

8.4 Recycling/Bottles – bins for bottle recycling are available by the East and West elevators. If these bins are full, you may bring your empty bottles to the hospitality office. Funds received from these bottles go towards resident programming.

8.5 Pink Room Stairwell Locked – a request was made to unlock the door leading from the east tower stairwell to the Pink Room. We will investigate the reasoning behind the decision to have a locked door in this location. For the time being, residents can use their perimeter key to unlock this door.

8.6 Annex Elevator – the annex elevator is currently down and they are working on the repair. We are not authorized to disturb/touch the elevators when they go down. We must call the elevator companies to send a technician. Meal delivery fees will be waived. Please call the main office for assistance.

8.7 Water Shutoff – there will be a building wide water shutoff on September 20<sup>th</sup> from 8pm – 4am.

8.8 Lifting Residents – a suggestion was made to have staff who are available and trained to lift residents who have fallen as there is currently an EMS/ambulance shortage. As an independent living facility, we do not have any medical staff or nurses present. Our staff cannot lift or move residents under any circumstances.

8.9 Bird Houses – we will not be adding bird houses to the new trees at the time. Please do not walk on the new sod.

8.10 Loonies for Laundry – a reminder that loonies may be purchased from the main office for use in the laundry room.

## 9. Administration Sharing:

9.1- Inner Courtyard Construction- scheduled for completion by Halloween.

9.2- East/North patio/landscaping construction is still in progress.

9.3- CARE RX services - will return to do BP clinics and educational presentations.

9.3- Flu Clinic- Pre-registration was required to have the shot at the Centre. Dated for Oct. 21, 2022. Please note that they will not be administering the latest COVID-19 booster.



9.4- September 30 will be a recognized federal holiday at the Centre- Office will be closed.


9.5- Ambassador Program – we are looking for volunteers for our new Ambassador Program. Ambassadors are volunteer residents who will help welcome, guide, and assist new residents. Please see the main office for more information or to sign up.

9.6- The Friends/Family Christmas dinner is scheduled for December 10, 2022. The start of ticket sales is still to be determined.
