COLD WEATHER

A friendly reminder not to leave windows or patio doors open during winter weather and cold temperatures. Pipes are prone to freezing and bursting in these conditions, which may cause flooding in suites and other areas. You will be responsible for the cost of repairs, cleaning, and damages if flooding occurs.

In extremely cold weather conditions, using a personal space heater may help to make your suite more comfortable. And keeping window coverings closed can also help retain heat loss through the glass.

Please call the Main Office @ 780-452-4444 and request a <u>Work Order</u> if you feel your suite thermostat is not adjusting properly to keep the suite temperature comfortable for you.

Please call the main office @ 780-452-4444 to request Work Orders for Maintenance tasks in your suite.

Most requests are completed the same day, and at no charge to the resident. You will be advised if fees are applicable to your request before the work order is dispatched to staff.

Please keep your windows and patio doors closed during very cold times to prevent baseboard heating pipes from freezing and bursting and possibly flooding your suite, neighbouring suites, and surrounding areas.

SUITE THERMOSTATS

Residents may want to turn up the heat in their suites in the colder weather.

If you are comfortable with changing the temperature setting on your thermostat yourself, please go ahead and increase it.

If you would prefer to have a Maintenance staff member perform this task, please call the Main Office to request a (no charge) work order. This also applies in any case where you feel your suite heating is not working properly.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT

DEBIT CARD SECURITY



Debit cards are accepted for purchases at the Garden Café, and at the Main Office for account payments and purchases of laundry coins, gift cards, and meal or coffee punch cards.

For your security, when using your debit card please avoid asking the Centre staff, or others, to enter your PIN (Personal Identification Number) on your behalf. PINs are designed to be CONFIDENTIAL and only known by the cardholder.

If your PIN is revealed and your card is later stolen, the likelihood of fraudulent transactions being processed on your account could be significant and difficult to prove.

If entering your PIN is difficult for any reason, we encourage using the "Tap" feature on your debit card instead of inserting your card. Our terminals are designed to accept both methods.

According to numerous experts – "Contactless cards are among the safest forms of payment. Tap-and-go is equally as secure as inserting a chip card and entering a PIN because both payment methods send a unique one-time code to the terminal to protect a customer's personal information."

If you don't have the "Tap" feature on your debit card, you can add it by contacting your bank directly. Normally they allow you to choose a dollar-value limit for "Tap" transactions that suits your comfort level and spending habits.

If you are concerned about potential fraudulent use of your debit card with the tap feature if you were to lose it, be assured that in general banks have comprehensive policies and necessary expertise to handle lost or stolen debit cards. They will help to block access to your account, cancel unauthorized transactions and re-issue a new card as soon as you report any issues to them. <u>Please enquire with your own bank about their specific policies and protections</u>.

St. Andrew's GIFT CERTIFICATES MAKE GREAT GIFTS!!

Purchase them in any denomination at the Main Office.

Garden Café Gift Certificates can be used for Food Services, Meals, or Groceries. *Hospitality* Gift Certificates are for Housekeeping, Laundry, or Special Cleaning services.



NOTE: Gift Cards are not redeemable for cash and cannot be replaced if lost.

- ✓ The amount of the Gift Certificate will be applied to the invoice for services rendered.

5. Additions to the Agenda to add under new business, accept Agenda

- 6. Business arising from the last meeting/old business:
 - Lights on the East parkade ramp: lights have been installed
 - Motorized scooter parking: outlets in the basement in front of the elevators have been installed. We will be adding painted lines for scooter parking for rent. This project is currently in progress.

7. Standing Agenda Items:

7.1- Food Service: Compliments to the Food Service staff for their hard work during the Christmas buffet.

7.2- Maintenance/Housekeeping: A complaint was made regarding the cleanliness of the floors in the building. The ride-on floor cleaning machine is broken. The staff are keeping up with cleaning the floors the best they can. There are currently job postings listed to fill the vacant positions in hospitality.

7.3- Social/Leisure Activities: the committee shared their appreciation for the activities during the Christmas season.

7.4- Security: the committee shared that they are fortunate and grateful to have security onsite.

8. New Business (suggestion box/Committee concerns): Suggestion Box:

8.1- Automatic door lobby washrooms: a letter was left in the suggestion box recommending the installation of automatic doors in the lobby washrooms. This has been a recurring request. We have been working with the Parish to come up with a solution as it is a shared space.

8.2- Walking Path: a complaint was made that the new walking path along the east and north side of the building has not been cleared. The walking paths cannot be salted as it may harm the new sod as well as the pathway itself. It was decided to not clear the path as it may be dangerous to walk on during the winter.

A suggestion was made to hire an external company for snow removal. The Centre has looked into this option in partnership with the Parish and it is something that we will continue to research.

9. Administration Sharing:

9.1- Smoking Shelter Letter: a signed letter was sent to Wanda and the Board of Directors with a request to have a smoking shelter built. The Board is currently in discussions about the matter and will bring their decision to the Citizen Forum on January 12th.

9.2- First Floor Patio's: the first floor patio railings and gates are almost all completed. Work will continue after the extreme cold weather stretch.

9.3- Citizen Forum: January 12, 2023, at 1:30pm, Auditorium – all are welcome to attend. Please bring any concerns forward during this time.

9.4- Extreme temperatures: a reminder to put in a work order to have your AC removed prior to winter in preparation for the cold weather. As a 40-year-old building, we are aware that the windows and patios doors need to be replaced. There are currently no supplies available. This is an ongoing project.
