At (tentative) date of March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023 has been set aside for *CareRx* to hold a vaccination clinic for St. Andrew's Centre citizens wishing to receive the <u>Bivalent</u> booster shot, which became available last Fall. **You must sign up** in advance at the Main Office (and complete a consent form) so that sufficient supply will be available.

<u>NO APPOINTMENTS will be given</u>. Instead, it will be done as a "Walk-In" clinic. Specific clinic hours will be determined later and details will be posted on noticeboards. *If you are unsure about being eligible or not, sign up and your record will be checked by clinic staff before the booster shot is given.*



## IN CASE of EXTREMELY COLD WEATHER

✓ Please ensure your windows (and patio doors) are <u>fully closed</u> during very cold temperatures.

✓ Pipes are prone to freezing and bursting, which may cause flooding in suites and other areas.

✓ You will be responsible for the cost of repairs, cleaning, and damages if flooding occurs.

Citizens may want to turn up the heat in their suites using the thermostat and/or use a personal space heater to help maintain a comfortable indoor temperature. Keeping window coverings closed can also be effective in retaining heat loss through the glass when outdoor temperatures are very low.

## St. Andrew's Centre Citizen Forum January 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023 – 10:30 am - Auditorium

**Present:** Wanda Beaudoin (COO), Don Delaney (Chairman of the St. Andrew's Centre Board of Directors), Melodie Lee (Finance Manger), Violet Vanmaele (HR Manager), Patricia Flores (Community Relations Manager), Tess Dela Cruz (Hospitality Manager), Lonnie Dykeman (Food Service Manager), Susan Sasvari (Community Enrichment Coordinator), all citizens of St. Andrew's Centre were invited to attend.

## Welcome and introductions.

## 1. Update

## **1.1. Centre Vacancies**

There are currently 26 vacant suites (9% vacancy rate). This vacancy rate is normal for the industry. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, we had a 2% vacancy rate.

## **1.2.** Suite Renovations/Progression Plan

- Move out renovation requirements vary from partial to full renovations. Either touch up painting, complete suite restoration or just a bathroom renovation. The timeline of these projects ranges from 2-4 weeks.
- 223 out of 303 suites have been renovated.
- We are exploring the replacements of suite windows and patio doors. There is currently a shortage of supply.

#### **1.3. Requests for Internal Moves**

• Internal moves will be prioritized to citizens in older suites.

## 2. Price Increases

## 2.1. Rent

- There will be no rental increase for 2023.
- Citizens can apply for external housing subsidies St. Andrew's staff cannot get involved with citizen financial affairs.

#### 2.2. Food Services

- Effective February 1<sup>st</sup> there will be an increase of roughly \$0.50 per meal.
- Breakfast/Lunch and Supper punch cards will increase \$5 per card. The price of the coffee punch card will not change.
- The last price change was in 2020.

## 2.3. Hospitality

- Effective February 1<sup>st</sup> hourly rate will increase to \$30/hour.
- The last price change was in 2018.

## 2.4. Parking/Storage

• Effective March 1<sup>st</sup> - both will increase \$5/month. Parking will now be \$55/month and storage will be \$30/month or \$35/month depending on the size of your storage space. Citizens with either parking or storage will receive a letter notifying them of the changes.

• The last price change was in January 2020.

## 3. Centre Programming

## 3.1. AMSA (Art Mentorship Society of Alberta)

• AMSA has not been able to maintain the contract for citizen programming. As a result, the contract has been ended effective February 6<sup>th</sup>.

## 3.2. Future Planning

- The AMSA office will be turned into the "Community Relations Office". Patricia will be focusing on marketing, recreational activities, and citizen wellness programming in this office.
- Susan will focus on gardening and maintaining the atrium/outdoor spaces. She will continue working in partnership with Patricia, her volunteers, and her wellness/fitness programs.
- A new Housing Coordinator position has been created recruitment is in progress.

## 4. Citizen Smoking Letter

- A letter requesting a designated smoking area/shelter was read to the forum attendants. An open discussion followed.
- It was requested by a citizen to do an informal vote on the matter:
  - There were an estimated 130 citizens present.
  - 9 raised their hands to abstain from voting.
  - 13 voted in favor for the smoking shelter.
- Should the Board of Directors go through with the decision to build a shelter, there will be a group discussion regarding the cost of the structure.

## 5. Questions/Comments for Open Discussion

## 5.1. Is there a way to test the air quality in the Centre?

• Air quality tests are performed by an external company. Tests have been done in the past and have come back clean. Connect with Wanda if you would like to request an air quality test.

## 5.2. The front lobby washroom needs to be more accessible. Can we install a button for the door?

• This is shared space with the Parish and should be a shared cost as well. This topic will be brought to the next joint meeting between the Parish and the Centre.

## 5.3. Can a resident of the Centre sit on the Board of Directors?

• This request has been brought up in the past, however, it is a conflict of interest and cannot be allowed. This policy was created by the Archdiocese. Any questions/concerns may be brought to the RCC (Resident Community Committee) meetings and you may email the board directly.

## 5.4. Does St. Andrew's pay city taxes?

• The Centre applies for a grant every year to cover the city taxes. It is currently assessed at \$400,000.

## 5.5. Can citizens socialize in the atrium and common spaces in the evening?

• Citizens may sit and visit anywhere they would like at all hours of the day. We are required to follow city noise bylaws. Security may ask citizens to keep the noise down if noise levels become unreasonable, however, common space is the right of all citizens.

## 5.6. A suggestion was made to have AEDs installed throughout the building.

• The AEDs must be maintained and secured. Staff would also need to be trained. It was also brought up that we would not be aware of who has signed a "do not resuscitate". This may not be suitable for our community.

- 7. Standing Agenda Items:

There were no comments or concerns in regard to Food Service, Maintenance/Housekeeping, Social/Leisure Activities, or Security.

8. New Business (suggestion box/Committee concerns):

Suggestion Box:

8.1 – Bringing in outside food: Clarification was asked about the rule surrounding bringing outside food into the atrium. The atrium is common space. You may eat outside food wherever you would like but we do ask that you reserve the tables directly outside of the Café for those purchasing food from them. Outside food cannot be brought into the Garden Café's dining room.

8.2 – Regular citizen gathering: a suggestion was left in the suggestion box to have regular gatherings for new citizens who "feel scared" and do not want to leave their suite. The Ambassador Program has been a huge success in regards to welcoming newcomers to the community. We already have regular gatherings such as the Welcome Party, morning coffee in front of the Café, and numerous activities throughout the week.

8.3 – Strong Scents: a complaint was submitted about the use of strong scents and perfumes. This is something that cannot be regulated. We are an independent living community. If you have any concerns with your fellow citizens, we ask that you handle the concern amongst yourselves.

9. Administration Sharing:

9.1 – February 24 Sweetheart Tea: we will be having a Valentine's Party on Friday, February 24<sup>th</sup> at 1:30pm in the Auditorium. This will be a free event for all citizens!

9.2 – Suite Insurance: a reminder that everyone is required to have active tenant insurance of \$2 million, third party liability. A copy of the renewal needs to be submitted to the main office annually.

9.3 – Internal Moves: we have been seeing an increase of internal move requests from newly renovated suites after 3-6 months. A repaint is required on fully renovated suites when a move occurs. Management is currently discussing charging a moving fee for internal moves from renovated suites to cover the painting/maintenance expenses.
