With the brighter days there has been more talk of the garden boxes, rose beds, and the courtyards.

Garden Boxes

Gardening here is free to residents and is done on your own accord. The garden boxes are assigned. The garden boxes are each person's responsibility so it is an expectation that your weeds are pulled, watering is maintained and if you are away or ill, make sure someone will look after it for you. We work on being able to provide some seeds, ensure necessary tools are available, and have volunteers that fill the water barrels.

Planting with mindfulness will be our theme this year. Mindfulness includes what we will harvest, the upkeep, various heights of plants and how this affects neighboring garden boxes. With individual garden boxes we still work as a community. However, it is expected that we act respectfully so if there is a garden that needs some attention contact the garden owner and if they are not available contact me. Gardening with mindfulness also extends to how we treat others. Respecting their gardens and how we act as stewards of the garden area is all part of this. Sharing ideas and information, offering help when required and more importantly, asking for help when we need it.

Sign-up for garden boxes begins Monday, March 6th at the main office. Whether you already have a garden box, or you would like to start gardening, please add your name to this list. For anyone with a second garden box these will only be available to you again this year if we have enough boxes for everyone that is interested. There are no guarantees on second boxes.

In April we will have a meeting for all gardeners to start the new season. For anyone wanting to plant tomatoes or obtain other seeds, the pots, soil, and seeds will be provided beginning of April. Watch for notices on dates/times for everything gardening related.

For anyone wanting to know details of this meeting or to fill out a questionnaire, you can ask me or leave me a message. Over the next two months there will be task specific meetings as follow-up.

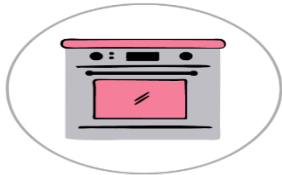
IN CASE of EXTREMELY COLD WEATHER

- ✓ You will be responsible for the cost of repairs, cleaning, and damages if flooding occurs.

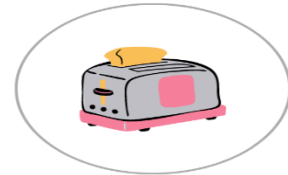

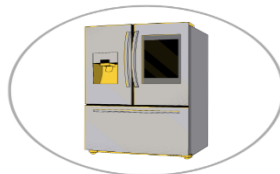

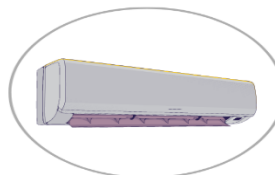

8. New Business (suggestion box/Committee concerns/emails):

Suggestion Box:

8.1- Offering smoking cessation- Letter read and it suggested ways to help people stop smoking with professional help such as addiction counselling. Discussion on this was not in favour. Melodie mentioned that people have been smoking for 30,40, 50 years and are not going to stop now. There are many resources out there and they know one of the best resources is their doctor. It is their personal choice to smoke.

8.2- Automatic door opener in Auditorium- Letter asked if it was expensive. Melodie let the group know that yes, it is expensive.

8.3- Prickly mat at entrance for wheelchairs- Discussion on mats and rags for people to wipe down their walkers or wheelchairs. Suggestion of having these supplies available at the front door then further comment was made that citizens should be responsible for their own supplies as this is independent living. Someone mentioned these supplies can be bought at the dollar store. Comment made regarding those that using scooters and those unable to clean off their wheels should go back and forth on the entrance mats to dry their wheels better.

Mel will ask Tess, Hospitality Manager, to enquire about different mats from their suppliers.

8.4 – Added to Agenda – Lock between parkade and buildings. Someone is concerned with the recent vehicle theft of anyone being able to get into the building. Discussion on ensuring people WAIT until the overhead door is all the way closed before parking or driving away. Melodie said the door from the parkade to the Centre used to be locked but they were removed due to safety.

8.5 – Added to Agenda – Update fire citizens listing regarding those with mobility aids. General discussion on when it is updated. Administration staff updates the listing as they are made aware of citizen's mobility impairment. Discussion regarding the fire cards to put them outside the door when you are unable to leave your suite during a fire alarm.

People who have recently acquired mobility aids should ensure the office is aware to update the list.
