# A Brief History of St. Andrew's Centre (Part II)

In March 1973, the first setback occurred when Archbishop Jordan felt that he was unable to support the project and recommended abandonment.

A new committee was formed consisting of Mitch Collins Father John Hesse, Julie Kearns, Joe Szaszkiewicz Chief Judge Ed Wachowich and Tony Whelan.

The revised presentation to Alberta Housing Corporation now recommended two 17-story towers with extensive facilities to accommodate 673 people at the cost of \$8,000,000.

Negotiations continued and seemed to be close to conclusion until the next setback occurred when Alberta Housing Corporation demanded full ownership of the land and the project. The committee refused to sell the land and the project was put on hold.

Throughout 1975 and 1976 meetings and negotiations continued between the committee, community representatives, the City of Edmonton and the Alberta Housing Corporation.

In October 1975, after five months review, the city commissioners recommended to City Council that the St. Andrew's project should be scuttled due to the opposition from the local community and some technical objections.

This bombshell generated an editorial in the Edmonton Journal, which call the decision "outrageous" and gave wholehearted support for the project.

The break came with approval from the City and when Alberta Housing announced in December 1976 that due to the introduction of the C.H.I.P. program, they were now in a position to fund the project while St. Andrew's retained ownership of the project.

After much effort and a considerable amount of local community concern, the final approvals were received in August 1977 and the project was finally underway. The plan called for two seven-story towers accommodating 315 units with a considerable amount of other amenities. The projected cost was \$12,000,000; a far cry from the original \$851,000 six year previous.

At this time, the St. Andrew's Centre planning committee was reformed with new members and the designation as a Board. The additions were Lyle Lavender (one of the original committee members of 1971), Margaret Dzenick and Douglas Mallet-Paret. Monsignor William Irwin (Father Bill as he was known at the time) came on the Board as the Archbishop's representative and Father Duncan MacDonnell replaced Father John Hesse as Pastor of St. Andrew's.

On July 9, 1978, the official sod turning ceremony and blessing took place for the new construction. Attended by all who had a hand in the planning and formulation of the Centre, the duties went to Alderman Olivia Butti representing City Council (Olivia's mother-in-law was at one time an active resident of the Centre), MLA Ken Proposki for the Province and Father MacDonnell for the Parish.

Construction continued for eighteen months and the first tenant moved in the end of 1979. (to be continued in next month's newsletter)

It was wonderful to see all the gardeners at the meeting earlier this month. # Other Things Outside

Thank you to all that attended the spring cleanup meeting and for your ambition that day. It was a good start to the cleanup.

For volunteers ready to get things done, postings start going up May 1st. The lists will outline tasks with dates/times as well as list alternate days in case of rain. These will be in the planting room and on various boards in the atrium.

#### **Koi Pond**

Thank you to everyone for watching over our sick Koi. There is still some residue of the infection seen in the dorsal fin and left pectoral fin but unless this gets worse the koi is fine.

## Have you noticed a beetle in your suite?

The Sawtoothed Grain beetle is very small (5 mm), dark brown, and does not fly. They prefer living in older trees and in rural areas, commonly a pest in grain containers. They can also come into a home to look for food or come in with groceries such as bagged grain. They are referred to as pantry pests.

This spring they were noticed inside and seemed to be coming from the outer wall heating systems. We suspect it is due to the trees coming down last fall causing displacement of this beetle. The insects would have been looking for a warm place as it got cool last fall. If anyone notices them, contact the office so we can ask maintenance staff to put out sticky traps. Currently, they are isolated to one apartment on the east side.
