FINANCE DEPARTMENT



CANADA POST

Effective June 1, 2025

Canada Post will no longer allows Centre staff any access to the mailroom.

They are citing financial reasons for the change.

Canada Post suggests that all of our correspondence be sealed in envelopes, stamped with postage and mailed out to our residents.



Aside from being a much less efficient process, it will be very costly to the Centre. Also, there is potential to create complications and delays. The enduring possibility of postal worker strike actions means that their services may not be available at all times.



Distributing documents without access to the mailroom will affect Centre operations significantly. Coordinating delivery of time-sensitive items, such as account invoices, payment receipts, notices and updates will be challenging.

Unfortunately, there are no simple solutions.

We are pursuing alternatives to full-price postage (currently \$1.23/item) as well as options to avoid using *Canada Post* altogether. Optimally, we hope to get documents directly to our residents, but minimize increased costs for labour, stationary, etc. This may include:

- E-Mail directly to residents, family or third-party payers.
- Pre-Authorized Payments ("PAP") to receive invoice payments from residents by automatic bank withdrawal (a reliable method currently being used by numerous residents).
- Scheduled Pick-Up dates for residents to retrieve invoices, receipts, etc. from the Main Office.
- Door Delivery (when necessary), either in person or posted on door.
- Reduced postage rate to mail out documents using Canada Post (if needed).

Thank You for your patience and cooperation while we navigate this issue!

IMPORTANT NOTES

- Mail delivered incorrectly by Canada Post, will no longer be redirected.
- If you have moved to a new suite within the building and fail to notify all your contacts and/or purchase mail forwarding from *Canada Post*, mail delivered to your previous suite mailbox will no longer be redirected.

If you receive any mail that <u>does not belong to you</u>
PLEASE DO NOT bring it to the Main Office.

According to Canada Post you are expected to cross through the address and mark "RTS" on the envelope, then drop into a red outgoing mailbox.

Adhering to these procedures enables the team to allocate resources effectively and prioritize tasks according to their urgency.




